Changes to charges for Scotland group trips.

Our trips are mostly to mountaineering club huts and we almost always have a surplus on accommodation but due to the difficulty of filling all the trip cars and by subsidising public transport we have a deficit on transport. Some years ago, to reduce food waste, we stopped providing communal breakfast and lunch supplies.

Consequently from 1st January 2026 the overnight charges on Scotland trips have been reduced by £4 per night, which participants can put towards their lunch and breakfast, and mileage charges have increased by one third. The reimbursement for cars remains the same.

Guidelines relating to Infectious Diseases including COVID

- No-one should go on a trip if they have **any** infectious illness, or symptoms such as a cold or flu, or Covid.
- As from January 2025 – The Covid testing policy set up in August 2023 is suspended.

National Trip Booking process (Updated November 2024)

1. Nobody is booked onto a trip until payment is received.
2. Those interested in attending should email the organiser, or if there isn't an organiser, the National Trips Secretary. *Note that a trip might be advertised before an organiser is found, but people can only express an interest (including offering to organise!).*
3. Once an organiser is identified, bookings will open. Those who have already expressed an interest will be notified (if more have expressed interest than capacity, those who expressed their interest later will go onto the top of the reserve list). Other members will receive notification via an updated entry in the MIS.
4. Those accepted on a trip will be notified by the trip organiser, who will give you a link to a booking form specific to the trip. Make the payment, preferably using a bank transfer (BACS) to the Red Rope Trips Account (sort code 08-92-99, account no 65829967) with a reference consisting of the trip code + first name + initial of surname. (e.g. for a 2023 Incheril trip, the code might be INCH23. For Jane Bloggs booking a place, the bank reference would then be INCH23JaneB). Please note **if you are paying from a Co-op personal account** you now cannot include a reference; please therefore email triptreasurer@redrope.org.uk with the trip code for the trip you are paying for. Please be careful that you pay money into this account rather than any other Red Rope accounts that you may have paid into in the past and may appear as options in your online banking page.
5. For trips of duration 4 nights or greater, a minimum of 50% of the full trip charges should be paid when booking. The balance will be due for payment no later than 1 month before the date of the trip. For shorter trips the full charge should be paid when booking.
6. If you cannot / don't want to do online or telephone banking, you can pay a cheque (or cash) into our account (using the details above) and notify triptreasurer@redrope.org.uk you have done this (as unlike BACS payments, no information about the payment would have been received by us). If you have any problems making payments, please contact the National Trips Treasurer. If you don't want to use the (Google) web form, you can email (or post) a booking form to the trip organiser and triptreasurer@redrope.org.uk
7. Two places (or 1 place on a small trip) are reserved for members who are in their first year of membership or haven't been on a national trip for 4+ years. If not taken by 3 months before the trip, these are opened up to everybody.
8. If the trip is full, you can opt to go on the reserve list.

- full refund if the cancellation is made more than 3 months before the trip starts.
- 25% payment of full nightly charges if the cancellation is made between 3 months and 1 month before the trip starts.
- 50% payment of full nightly charges if the cancellation is made less than 1 month before the trip starts.
